### World's Stupidest Criminals

A 20-year old drug dealer in Omaha, Nebraska, got one number wrong and accidentally paged undercover narcotics officer Sgt. Mark Langon in February 1996. Langon realized he'd been contacted by a drug dealer by the man's terminology, set up a meeting to buy crack cocaine, and busted his target.

Clarisse Wynn and Darvie Sutton made their way into a Chicago bar in December 1995 by claiming that they were delivering food to a retirement party going on inside. This was simply a cover for a holdup, of course; but what they hadn't realized was that among the party-goers were over 100 police officers, who quickly subdued them when the alarm was raised. "That's what makes this job so interesting," said a police spokesman. "Dumb people."

# Recipe of the Month Sweet Potato Cake

1 ½ c all-purpose flour
1 tsp each baking powder and baking soda
1 tsp ground cinnamon
¼ tsp ground ginger
½ tsp each ground cloves and nutmeg
½ c plus 2 tbsp reduced-calorie margarine
6 oz cooked sweet potatoes, mashed
1 tsp vanilla extract
½ tsp orange extract
1 egg plus 2 egg whites
¼ c sugar (or sweetener equivalent to 12 tsp sugar)
¼ c skim milk

Into a large bowl, sift flour, baking powder, baking soda, and spices. Add margarine and mix with a fork or pastry blender until mixture resembles course crumbs. Combine remaining ingredients in a large bowl. Beat on low speed of an electric mixer until well blended. Add dry ingredients to potato mixture, beating until all ingredients are moistened. Beat on high speed 1 minute. Place mixture in a  $6 \times 10$ -inch glass baking pan that has been sprayed with a nonstick cooking spray. Bake 30 minutes, at  $325^\circ$ , until a toothpick inserted in the center of the cake comes out clean. Cool in pan on wire rack. Serves 10, 173 calories per serving.

#### Sautéed Mushrooms in White Wine

2 tbsp plus 2 tsp reduced-calorie margarine 4 c sliced mushrooms <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub> tsp garlic powder salt & pepper to taste <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> c dry white wine

Melt margarine in a large nonstick skillet over medium heat.

Add mushrooms. Sprinkle with garlic powder and salt and pepper.

Cook, stirring occasionally, until mushrooms are tender, about 5 minutes.

Add wine. Cook, stirring, until heated through.
