Recipe of the Month

Orange Dreamsicle Dessert

Crust

4-1/2oz graham cracker crumbs (18 2-1/2 inch graham crackers, crushed)
1/4 c margarine, melted
1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp freshly grated orange peel

Filling

2-1/4c part-skim ricotta cheese
3 eggs
1 tbsp all-purpose flour
2 tsp vanilla extract
1/4 c sugar (or sweetener equivalent to 12 tsp sugar)

Topping

3 tbsp cornstarch
2 c orange juice (unsweetened)
1 tbsp lemon juice
1/2 tsp orange extract
1/4 c sugar (or sweetener equivalent to 12 tsp sugar)
4 c fresh orange sections, white membrane removed (Navel oranges make the best choice.)

Preheat oven to 350° .

Combine crust ingredients in a 9 x 13-inch baking pan. Press gently onto the bottom of pan to form a crust.. Bake 8 minutes.

In a blender container, combine all filling ingredients. Blend until smooth. Pour over crust.

Bake 18 to 20 minutes, until set. Cool completely.

In a saucepan, dissolve cornstarch in orange juice. Add lemon juice, orange extract, and sugar. (If using NutraSweet as sweetener, add it after cooking.) Bring mixture to a boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Boil 1 minute, stirring. Remove from heat. Allow to cool 5 minutes, then gently stir in orange sections. Spread mixture evenly over cooled cheese filling. Chill. Cut into squares to serve. Serves 12.
