Recipe of the Month

Fillet of Sole Oregano

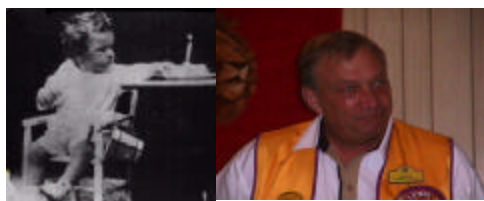
2	tblsp plus 2 tsp reduced-calorie margarine
1/2	cup chopped onions
2	cup sliced mushrooms
1 1/2	lbs sole or flounder fillets
2	tblsp lemon juice
1	tblsp dried parsley flakes
1 1/2	tsp dried oregano
1/8	tsp pepper
1/2	cup water
1	packet instant chicken-flavored broth mix

Melt margarine in a large nonstick skillet over medium heat. Add onions and mushrooms and cook until tender.

Push onion mixture to one side of skillet and add fish. Sprinkle with lemon juice, parsley, oregano, and pepper.

Arrange onion mixture over fish.

Combine water and broth mix and add to pan. Cover, reduce heat to low, and simmer 20 minutes. This recipe is great with a side dish of pasta and a tossed salad. Makes 4 servings.
