## Recipe of the Month Pork 'n Beans Bread

- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 2 16 oz can pork and beans drained
- 3 cups flour
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 cup raisins (optional)

350° 50-55 minutes

2 8 ½ x 4 ½ “ loaf pans

Mix: sugar, oil, eggs, and beans till smooth. In separate bowl combine flour, cinnamon, powder and soda. Add to bean mixture stirring just till combined. Stir in vanilla & raisins.

Grease or spray pans. Cool completely on wire rack before removing bread from pans.
